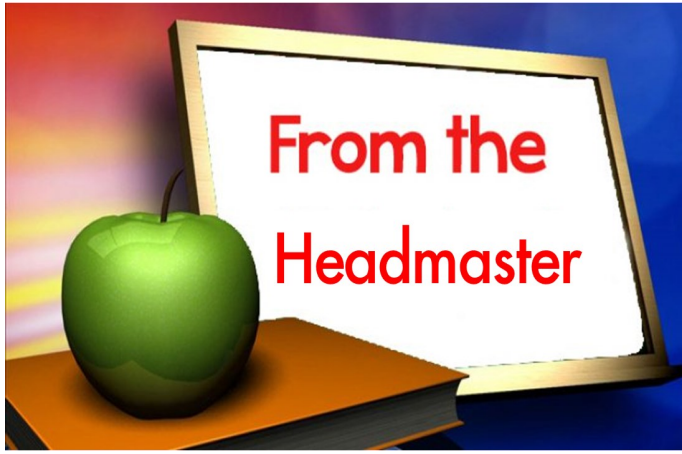

At a Bible Study over the weekend, a gentleman asked me why traveling before winter was important enough for both Jesus and Paul to reference it in their words. We had been reading 2 Timothy 4 in which Paul asks for Timothy “come quickly” and to do his best to arrive “before winter.” When speaking of days of great persecution, Jesus tells the disciples to pray that they do not have to flee in winter. It is rea-

sonable to think that resources may have been difficult to acquire at that time of the year and traveling over a long distance or with great speed would have been difficult. Modern means of transportation eliminate many of the concerns of traveling in winter, except when frozen precipitation such as freezing rain, sleet, or snow covers the roads.

Paul enjoyed friendship and fellowship with Timothy. He desires to spend a few more minutes together before his time on earth is over. If Timothy could arrive before winter, it would increase Paul’s opportunity to encourage him, instruct him, and inspire him. Timothy had been left in some precarious situations, and when you read Paul’s letters written to him, it is obvious that these needs remained in his life.

One of the many devotional books written by Chuck Swindoll is entitled, “Come Before Winter, and Share My Hope.” Each page contains an uplifting and inspiring thought intended to sustain every disciple when the world seems cold and darkness seems to last longer than daylight. Winter brings its own set of challenges in all phases of life – physical, mental, and emotional – and they don’t just appear between December 21<sup>st</sup> and March 20<sup>th</sup>. Paul’s words to Timothy serve as a reminder of the importance of friendship and fellowship within the Christian Community. The writer of the letter to the Hebrews says it this way, “Let us not forsake the assembling of ourselves together as some are in the habit of doing.” You may have something to give or stand in need of something to receive: encouragement, inspiration, instruction. The strength of the early church was established on this idea of community (Acts 2:42)!
